Born in Horodniceni (Suceava), Romania in 1951.

Bachelor's Degree in Economics from the "Al. Ioan Cuza" University of Iasi, Faculty for Economic Studies. Doctor's in accounting from the Academy for Economic Studies, Faculty of Accounting and IT Management, in Bucharest. In addition, Mr Ispir has attended many seminars at the UK National Audit Office and KPMG in various audit fields such as financial audit, audit of the EAGGF and International Audit Standards.

From 1974 to 1979, he worked as an economist at the O.J.T. (Regional Travel Office) of Prahova, Sinaia.

From 1979 to 1994, Mr Ispir was, successively, economist, Head of Office, Head of Department and Deputy General Manager in charge with economic and financial issues at the Youth Travel Office (C.B.T.T) in Bucharest.

From 1994 to 1997, he was Vice-president in charge of economic and financial issues at the S.C. "Group Management" S.A.

From 1997 to 1999, Mr Ovidiu Ispir worked as an adviser to the Romanian Minister of Finance.

From 1999 to 2006, he was a Counsellor of Accounts at the Romanian Court of Accounts in Bucharest. He coordinated the activities of various audit Divisions in charge with auditing the State budgetary implementation annual general account, the implementation annual account of Romania's public debt, and the implementation of local public authorities budgets. He was also responsible for the audit of the pre-accession funds granted to Romania (ISPA, SAPARD).

Mr Ispir also worked as an expert within the parliamentary group of the Chamber of Deputies that initiated legislative proposals in March 2005 on the enhancement of the legislation relating to the Romanian Court of Accounts.

He has published specialized issues in the fields of external public audit in EU Member States Internal financial control and internal audit of public entities.

From January 2007 until 31 May 2010, Mr Ispir was a Member of Audit Group II "Structural policies, transport, research and energy".

Since 1 June 2010, following the reorganisation of the Court, Mr Ispir is a Member of Chamber II "Structural policies, transport and energy" and an Alternate Member of the CEAD Chamber "Coordination, evaluation, assurance and development".
