Defining Evaluation

- GAO's Definition:
 - Systematic study using research methods to collect and analyze data to assess how well a program is working and why
- Used for both accountability and program improvement
- Studies tailored to address customer questions credibly within available resources



Types of Evaluation

- Performance Measurement and Evaluation: Definitions and Relationships (GAO-11-646SP)
 - Process (or implementation) evaluation
 - Outcome Evaluation
 - Impact Evaluations
 - Cost-Benefit and Cost-Effectiveness Analyses

GAO Evaluation Work

- GAO study types
 - Performance Audits
 - Financial Audits
 - Routine Non-Audits
- Range of Quantitative and Qualitative Methods
 - Surveys, Focus Groups, Interviews, and other collection of testimonial evidence
 - Reviews of documentary and physical evidence
 - Use of primary and secondary data in descriptive and statistical analyses



Agency Evaluation Systems

- GAO reviews other agencies in terms of:

 - Agency Plans, Agendas, and Learning Goals
 - (GAO-17-743) <u>Program Evaluation: Annual Agency-Wide Plans</u> <u>Could Enhance Leadership Support for Program Evaluations</u>
 - Agency Processes, Implementation, and Use
 - (GAO-17-775) <u>Managing for Results: Further Progress Made in</u> <u>Implementing the GPRA Modernization Act, but Additional</u> <u>Actions Needed to Address Pressing Governance Challenges</u>



Agency Program Evaluations

GAO Assesses Evaluations performed by agencies (or via agency contracts)

- Specification of research objectives/goals
 - (GAO-12-673) President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief: Agencies Can Enhance Evaluation Quality, Planning, and Dissemination
- Appropriate design and methodology
 - (GAO-17-316) Foreign Assistance: Agencies Can Improve the Quality and Dissemination of Program Evaluations
- Reliable data and accurate analysis
 - (GAO-18-220) <u>Medicaid Demonstrations: Evaluations Yielded Limited</u> <u>Results, Underscoring Need for Changes to Federal Policies and Procedures</u>
- Contextually sophisticated findings, conclusions, and recommendations
 - (GAO-13-570) Program Evaluation: Strategies to Facilitate Agencies' Use of Evaluation in Program Management and Policy Making



GAO-led evaluation efforts

- Congressional Requests
- Research Design and Methodologies
- Resource Considerations
- Types of Findings, Conclusions, and Recommendations
- Financial and Non-Financial Accomplishments



GAO-led Impact Evaluations

- Typically intended for prospective decision making
- May utilize a variety of approaches, including quasiexperimental designs, multivariate analysis, and simulation
- Staff and financial resources needs vary
- Results may focus on considerations, options, and tradeoffs, rather than assessment of evidence against particular criteria
- Less likely to have recommendations/accomplishments


GAO Effect of Broadband on Economic Development: Objective

"Does federal support for broadband access in rural areas increase economic performance?"

- Some challenges to estimating impact:
 - Many factors influence economic development;
 - Geographic boundaries of affected areas did not correspond to political jurisdictions (e.g., counties); and
 - Broadband access does not necessarily mean broadband use.

GAO Effect of Broadband on Economic Development: Objective

U.S. Counties with One or More Approved RUS Broadband Loans, 2002-2013





Quasi-Experimental Design

- Compared counties that received broadband loans with three sets of similarly situated counties, including:
 - Counties with projects that were rejected for loans;
 - Counties that were similar based on observable characteristics; and
 - Counties that were geographically adjacent.
- Compared these counties based on annual measures of economic performance, including:
 - Employment;
 - Payroll; and
 - Number of business establishments.



Data and Analytic Methods

- Two sources of data:
 - USDA Rural Utilities Service rural broadband loan program application information; and
 - Census, County Business Patterns, annual performance information.
- Methods:
 - Proximity scoring regressions to select (some) control groups.
 - Created a panel dataset of 9 annual observations for each county.
 - Fixed effects regression.
 - Binary loan indicator, 1 after year of loan approval in approved counties, and 0 in counties before loan approval and in control group counties.

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Key Findings

• We found that areas affected by at least one approved broadband loan were associated with modestly higher levels of employment and payroll (1 to 4 percent) after the year of loan approval and in all subsequent years, as compared to areas that did not receive RUS loans.

• Our findings were robust across all control groups.
