

Martin Weber, Director, Audit Chamber II — Investment for cohesion, growth and inclusion, European Court of Auditors, Luxembourg

Martin Weber joined the European Court of Auditors in 1999. In 2014 he has been appointed Director of the Audit Chamber II, responsible for auditing EU policies and spending in the area of Cohesion (including regional and social policy), employment, transport and energy. From 2010 to 2014, he was responsible as Head of unit for the Court's financial and compliance audits in this field, contributing to the Court's annual 'Statement of assurance'. Prior to this position, he worked as Head of Private Office for two Members of the Court: Henri Grethen (from 2007 to 2010) and François Colling (from 2002 to 2007). Before joining the Court, Mr Weber worked as a consultant at Arthur Andersen and Roland Berger and as teaching assistant at Rutgers University. He studied at Reims Management School (France), Lancaster University (UK) and ESB Reutlingen (Germany) and holds a Master in Economics of Rutgers University (USA).
